



The attractive Cambridgeshire villages of Chippenham and Snailwell repay exploration and provide good refreshment stops. Many of the older buildings contain walling made of locally guarried chalk rock known as 'clunch'. The intervening countryside is characteristic of the fringes of the Breckland with wide open spaces. Chippenham Fen is a National Nature Reserve, home to many rare species. Access is limited to the public footpath unless you get a permit. The approaches to Newmarket are dominated by racehorses, so keep well clear of any that you may encounter where the path runs alongside exercise tracks (less likely in the afternoon) and do not interfere with them in any way where the path goes through paddocks.


Kennett station is isolated and not all trains call. so it's best to start walks from here and finish at larger centres with better services and facilities.


