
Key to landscape features

ROUTE FINDING

IRONBRIDGE PATH AT FORDHAM


Re-opened Soham station provides a convenient break point for walks between Ely and Newmarket; also the opportunity to explore the town's historic features from an extensive network of local paths. All Ipswich to Peterborough trains via Bury St Edmunds and Ely call, including Sundays.


Chippenham Fen National Nature Reserve is of great botanical interest, a reedy 'wildscape' where fens and breckland merge. The public path through the fen is often wet underfoot and may be boggy or even flooded in winter. Access is limited to the path unless you have a permit from Natural England.

Fordham Woods Nature Reserve and a network of short paths within the village repay exploration, notably the Ironbridge Path leading to the Townsend arboretum.





