
### Key to landscape features

#### **ROUTE FINDING**

You will need a basic understanding of maps and the ability to follow them. The walks can be followed in either direction, but if you go in the same way as the arrows, you won't have to turn the map around to fit the landscape.

#### TIME

Allow about 3 hours, but longer if visiting colleges, museums, churches etc.

#### **MAPS**

OS Explorer sheet 209 or Landranger sheet 154 (both Cambridge). The location of Cambridge North station is approx TL474 604.

There is plenty of choice of pubs, restaurants and cafes.

KING'S COLLEGE


The walk includes several of the best-known views in Cambridge, as well as picturesque byways through the city, where ancient colleges and modern commerce mingle.


Enjoy punting scenes on the upper river before following riverside paths across extensive greens and commons often grazed by cattle.


Boating activity downstream may be frantic as college and town crews compete in traditional 'bumps' rowing races. BEWARE BIKES along every part of the route - or bring your own!
